- Intrigues Black Lady: Prior owner contacted, John Lapp. Also owned Springmill Aire Apparent. Really nice Amish guy.. He was more than happy to share info on Lady. There was an owner after him. Another Amish friend. He did not update the papers and last John had heard he was going to keep her and just use her as a broodmare. He used her for driving ~ 4 wheel cart. The only reason he got rid of her is she had too much go and ambition for his family. Was "go go go" all the time and very forward. This next guy bought her and did use her for a foal but also riding and driving. She was pin-fired with this next owner. About 1.5 yrs after John had sold her to him, she got away from the man while hooking her and she ran into a wall. After that she was pin-fired but he never used her but for a broodmare. Under John's care and time the mare was sound, just too much horse for his family. He was surprised that he took her through NH. But happy we were trying to place her. The other two listed as owners and breeders are Amish. Voicemail rings but is very full so I can't do anything else with it but try and catch them. I was unable to contact as of 6-28-13.

Foster-Follow-up Committee: Danny Collins Chair - The follow-up on the current fosters hasn't yielded a lot of information yet.
